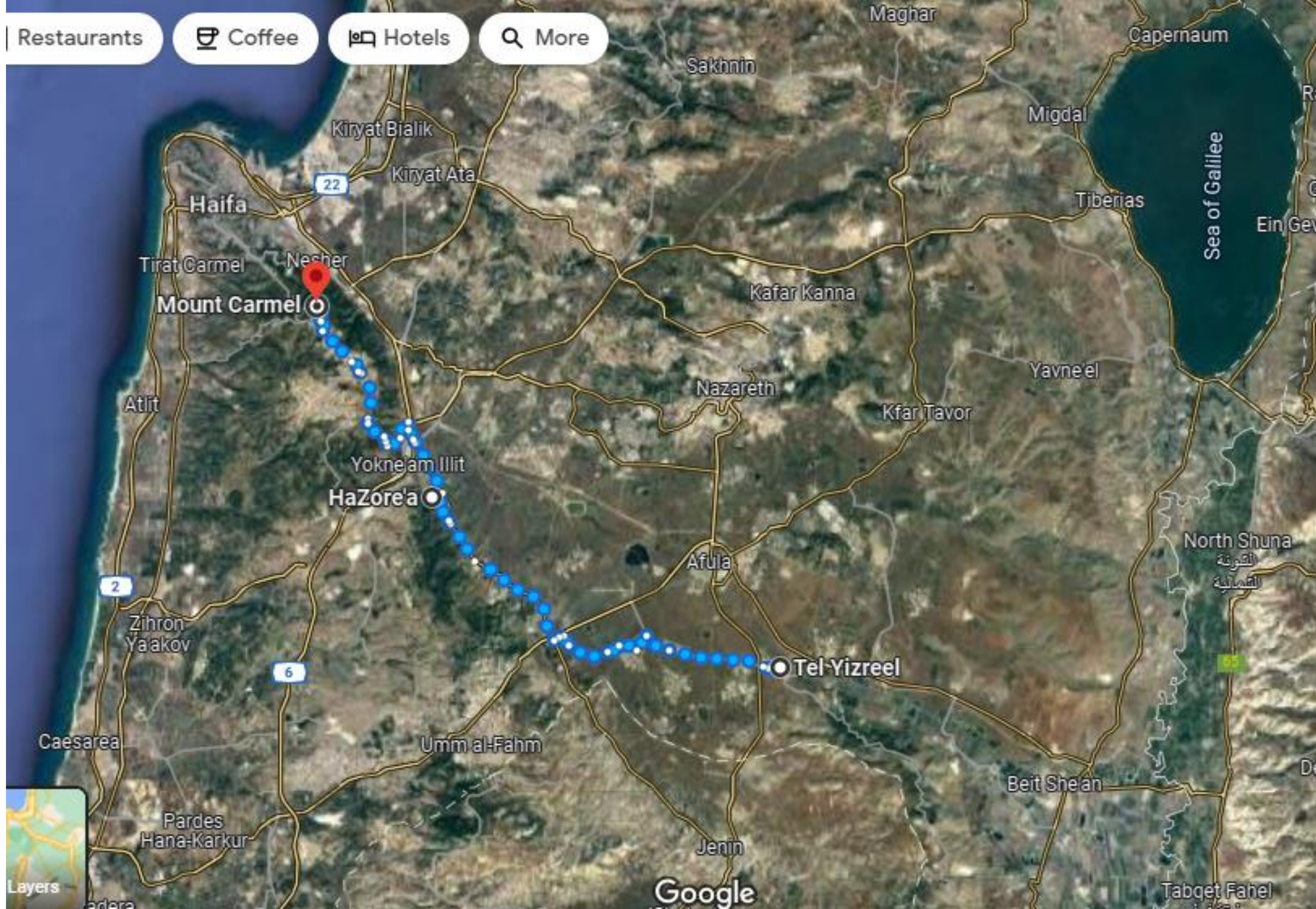

**Edward Robinson, 1838**  
**(“*Biblical researches*”, pp. 300-1)**

**“... two deep wells, still called Bir es-Seba’, the ancient Beersheba...**

**These wells are some distance apart**

**they are circular, and stoned up very neatly with solid masonry...**

**The larger one is 12 ½ feet in diameter, and 44 ½ feet deep to the surface of the water; 16 feet of which at the bottom is excavated in the solid rock.**

**The other well lies 55 rods W. S. W., and is 5 feet in diameter and 42 feet deep.**

**The water in both is pure and sweet, and in great abundance...**

**Both wells are surrounded with drinking-troughs of stone for camels and flocks...**

**The curb-stones were deeply worn by the friction of the ropes in drawing up water by hand.”.**
